The Road to States

After winning the Capitol City East Division, with a record of 11-2 in Conference play and 16-8 in Non-Conference play, the Varsity Boy's Soccer Team earned a trip to the CAASC State Playoffs! The Warriors earned a four-seed and started play with #5 Seed Noble Academy. The Warriors made quick work of Noble Academy and walked away with a dominant 7-0 Victory. Junior, Zach Winterstein led the way for the Warriors with four goals on six attempts. Junior, Austin Dixon also played well as he swung in to beautiful crosses that resulted in two assists. After their victory the Warriors found out their Quarter-Final Match-Up would be against the top overall seed in the tournament, Carter G. Woodson out of Winston-Salem, NC. After letting in an early Zach Winterstein opened up the contest with a quick goal, which was quickly countered by Zach Winterstein slotting a ball into the lower corner of the net. With five

minutes remaining Junior Keeper, Gabe Jewett had already recorded seven saves made a huge save that resulted in Chandler Stephenson putting the ball in the net giving the Warriors a 2-1 lead. Quickly after that Zach, again found the back of the net and the "underdogs" walked away with a 3-1 victory. Next up for the Warriors was CCAC Rival Thales Rolesville who beat the shorthanded Warriors 3-0. However, the Warriors bounce back in the consolation game against #2 seed New Gardens Friendship Academy in Greensboro. Senior, Daniel Krauss finished the game with four assists and Zach Winterstein had his second hat trick of the tournament. Chandler Stephenson and Gabe Jewett split time in the net and provided the Warriors with another shutout!

The Warriors finished 3rd in the State and are eagerly awaiting next season and another shot at a CAASC State-Title.

MS Boys Soccer - Our Goal? Stopping Yours

The Warriors MS Boys Season looked to complete the Warriors' sweep of CACC Conference Championship in the East Division ... and they did just that! The MS Boys Soccer Team is no stranger to success as they enter their fifth season. However, they entered this season with a different unknown ... a new coach leading the way. CAASC Coach of the Year Nominee, Eric O'Neil, and his Assistant Coach Paul Milner coached the Warriors this season to their first CACC Conference Title and earned a #2 seed in the CAASC State Playoff tournament!

The MS Boys Team was absolutely dominant this season as they scored 75 goals across 15 games. Including deep runs in both the CCAC East/West Conference Tournament and the CAASC State Playoffs. The Warriors were lead by the dynamic 6th grade duo of Pete Winterstein and Tanner Cole, who combined for 40 goals and 10 assists. Will Purdum was a Rock in the net for the Warriors as he tallied 57 saves and 4 shut outs this season! Cole Roberts and J.T O'Neil played well in the midfield and limited our opponent's chances to create and plays. When teams did break through our 8th Grade defense of Jacob Floars, Cameron Glowgower, Andrew Chandler, Connor Cowan, and Harley Cole held fast and only allowed 30 goals against them on the season.

The MS Boys Soccer Team finished 11-2 in Conference play and 13-5 in non-Conference play and two of those losses came down to Overtime and Penalty Kicks!

The Warriors ended up finishing second in the CCAC East/West Soccer Tournament beating LifeSpring Academy 9-0 and Southern Wake Academy 7-3 on their way to face cross-conference rival Thales Rolesville who they would loose to in the Conference Tournament Final.

The tired Warriors ended up having a State Playoff game two days after their last tournament game and gave it their all but fatigue and injuries proved to be too much as the Warriors lost a stunner to Triangle Math and Science in the State Quarter Finals in Penalty Kicks. The team wants to wish it's 8th graders: Jacob Floars, Cameron Glowgower, Andrew Chandler, Connor Cowan, and Harley Cole the best of luck on Varsity and are excited to have a new group of 6th graders joining their quest for a Conference Championship repeat and ultimately a State Title.
